Standard Operating Guideline – 09-01 Use of Flashing Lights

Purpose: This standard is designed to set guidelines for personnel using flashing lights while responding to the station

Scope: All fire department personnel.

- 1. Only members authorized by the Fire Chief may use flashing lights in accordance of Title 21 Chapter 43 Subchapter II of the Delaware Code, which allows a Firefighter or EMT use flashing alternating headlights.
- 2. Must have a current valid Driver License
- 3. Must be over the age of 18
- 4. Must obtain an Emgency Vehicle Operator License.
- 5. Must Sign the Responsible Use Policy on use of flashing lights
- 6. While using the flashing lights the member must understand they are not an emergency vehicle and must obey all traffic laws.
- 7. The Fire Company insurance does not cover you vehicle while responding to an emergency. Use of your personal vehicle is at your own risk
- 8. Officers of the Company authorized by the Fire Chief and in accordance of Title 21 Chapter 43 Subchapter II of the Delaware Code may use a Blue and White flashing lights. These officers as identified by the Code are the Fire Chief, Deputy Fire Chief, Assistant Fire Chief, Chief Engineer, Fire Police Officer, and EMS Officer.
- 9. Failure to follow any of the above rules can result in losing the privilege of using flashing lights.
